Dear members,

a great deal of effort was made at the end of last year to enable a number of our boats to join the Royal Langkawi regatta. We haven't sailed in this regatta for a few years because of COVID and the time came to reengage with them and have some racing against new opposition and another country. What many people did not know was that the Thai authorities had thrown up a new condition for leaving the country in a boat which involved an expensive one way trip payment. It's not clear what the purpose of this is but it seems like an attempt to get some money from boats which are being sold abroad before they go. In any event this was not appropriate to the Phuket Yacht Club which was sending three or four competitive yachts down to Langkawi to take part in an amateur regatta and return the following week.

The existing regulations make no allowance for private boats enjoying themselves in this way and they are for the commercial voyages of vessels and therefore demand that Thai skippers are on the boats and numerous other conditions need to be satisfied to enable a very simple exercise to be executed.

Representatives of the Phuket Yacht Club went to see the marine office bearing gifts and attempting to explain the situation and the amateur nature of the business being done. In spite of all sorts of assurances and encouragement in the end it proved very very difficult for the boats to get clearance to go and do the racing. I'm pleased to say that some boats did go South to Langkawi and compete in the racing. The result of this was a complete success with our multihull races finishing first second and third in their division (Twin Sharkes , Saffron and Trident) and our monohull representative (Phoenix) finished second in the monohulls. It has to be hoped that whatever motivated these regulations, these difficulties in obtaining a temporary exit visa to do the racing can be overcome as clearly with these difficulties in mind few boats will attempt it in the future.

It is too early to attempt a digested view of the Bay Regatta but already we are hearing hair raising tales about the race back!
